

ORDINANCE NO. 26-01

ORDINANCE OF THE BOARD OF DIRECTORS OF THE LOCKEFORD COMMUNITY SERVICES DISTRICT AMENDING RULES AND REGULATIONS FOR DISTRICT PARKS AND RECREATION FACILITIES

BE IT ORDAINED by the Board of Directors of the Lockeford Community Services District as follows:

SECTION 1. Purpose and Authority. The purpose of this Ordinance is to amend the Rules and Regulations for the District's parks and recreation facilities. Upon its effective date, this Ordinance shall supersede and replace District Ordinance No. 18-01, which is hereby repealed in its entirety. This Ordinance is adopted under the authority provided in Government Code sections 61060 and 61100, and other applicable law. This Ordinance may be known as and may be cited as the "Park Ordinance"

SECTION 2. Definitions. For purposes of these Rules and Regulations, the following terms shall have the meanings set forth below:

- "Motorized Vehicle" means any self-propelled vehicle powered by an internal combustion engine, electric motor, battery, or other mechanical means, whether designed for on-road or off-road use. Motorized Vehicles include, but are not limited to, cars, trucks, motorized scooters, go-karts, mini-bikes, dirt bikes, all-terrain vehicles, utility task vehicles, motorized bicycles, and electric bicycles.
- "Park" means both the indoor and outdoor portions of the District's park and recreation facilities located at 19258 Jack Tone Road in Lockeford, California, including: (A) the parking lot; (B) the Community Center, to the extent this Ordinance's relevant term applies to indoor facilities; and (C) Lockeford Memorial Park. "Community Center" means the indoor recreation facilities located at 19258 Jack Tone Road in Lockeford, California.

SECTION 3. Compliance and Enforcement. No person shall enter, be in, or remain in any Park unless he or she complies with all applicable rules and regulations provided in this Ordinance. The District General Manager, District Assistant General Manager, or San Joaquin County Sheriff may enforce this Ordinance. Any enforcement action taken by a District employee pursuant to these Rules and Regulations shall be conducted while the employee is wearing an official District uniform. Any violation of this Ordinance is punishable: (1) on first instance, in the form of a written warning; (2) on second instance and thereafter, by a fine of not more than \$250, or as otherwise authorized by law.

SECTION 4. Specific Regulations. The following rules and regulations apply in Parks, unless otherwise stated:

- 1) **Hours.** No person shall enter or remain in a Park between one hour after sundown and one hour after sunrise the next day. These restrictions do not apply to events at the Community Center, for which no person shall enter or remain in the Community Center or its immediate vicinity after 10:00 p.m., for an event operated with permission of the General Manager, as provided in Paragraph 10 below.
- 2) **Night Camping.** No person shall set up tents, shacks, house trailers, motor homes, campers or any other temporary or permanent shelter for the purpose of overnight camping in a Park. No person leave in any such place any movable structure or special vehicle to be used or that could be used for such a purpose, such as a house trailer, tent, shopping cart, automobile, or the like.
- 3) **Day Camping.** No person shall erect, configure, or construct camping facilities in a Park from one hour after sunrise to one hour after sunset. A person must take down, fold, deconstruct, or put away any tent erected, configured, or constructed in any such Park during such time period.
- 4) **Harmful Objects.** No person shall use, throw, hit, or otherwise propel any object in such a manner or in such a place in a Park to endanger the safety of others, except as authorized by the General Manager. The General Manager may establish rules to authorize and regulate the place and time for such activities.
- 5) **Damage.** Except with written permission of the General Manager, no person shall: (A) damage, harm, or remove any District property in a Park; or (B) damage, harm, or remove any wood, plant, or other natural object, or any animal or fish, in a Park.
- 6) **Rubbish.** No person shall: (A) throw, leave, place, deposit or dispose of any garbage, refuse, wastepaper, bottles, or cans in any place in a Park other than into a garbage can or receptacle maintained for that purpose; or (B) place any household garbage in any trash receptacle within a Park. No person shall remove any garbage, refuse, wastepaper, bottles, cans, or aluminum from any District receptacle without a permit issued by the General Manager.
- 7) **Glass Containers.** No person shall possess any beverage container made of glass in any Park or bring, carry, or transport any beverage container made of glass into any Park.

- 8) **Alcoholic Beverages.** No person shall possess or consume in a Park any malt, spirituous, or vinous liquor having an alcoholic content in excess of 1% by volume, except as authorized by permit issued by the General Manager. The General Manager may not issue a permit without proof of any license or permit as required by the Alcoholic Beverage Control Act
- 9) **Notices.** No person shall distribute any handbills or circulars, or post, place or erect any bill, notice, paper, or advertising device or matter of any kind in a Park without the written permission of the General Manager.
- 10) **Events.** No person shall conduct any class, special event, tournament, whether or not for profit, or locate any inflatable party jumpers or portable event structures, in a Park, without a permit issued by the General Manager. The vendor or person conducting a class, event or tournament shall have the permit in possession in a Park at all times that vendor or person is within a Park for the purpose of such sale or activity.
- 11) **Sales.** No person shall sell or offer for sale any merchandise, article, or thing whatsoever in a Park, except as part of an event with permission of the General Manager, under Paragraph 10.
- 12) **Animals.** No person shall bring and maintain in a Park any animal except as permitted in this section or otherwise authorized by the General Manager. Dogs are allowed in the outdoor premises of a Park so long as the person responsible: (a) keeps the dog on a leash at all times and (b) immediately cleans up and properly disposes of any dog waste. No dogs are allowed in indoor Park facilities except for seeing eye and guide dogs.
- 13) **Park Waters.** No person shall use Park facilities or conduct on Park grounds any washing or cleaning of vehicles, dishes, utensils, or other items.
- 14) **Skate Boards and Roller Skates.** No person shall use a skateboard or roller skates in any Park, except within a designated facility provided for that purpose, without prior approval by the General Manager.
- 15) **Motorized Vehicles.** No person shall use any Motorized Vehicle in any Park without prior approval by the General Manager.
- 16) **Weapons.** No person may bring or possess any weapon in a Park, except as otherwise authorized by law or by the General Manager. Concealed carry of handguns is permitted in a Park with a valid license under California Penal Code sections 26150-26225. No person may discharge or use any weapon in a Park unless permitted by the General Manager, San Joaquin County Sheriff, or their designees.

17)**Fires.** No person shall ignite or permit to be ignited, or maintain or permit to be maintained, a fire in any location in a Park except in a designated campfire site, barbecue pit, fireplace, or cooking area provided by the District for the purpose of maintaining a fire, except as permitted in writing by the General Manager. No person shall leave live coals or fires unattended.

18)**Smoking.** Smoking is prohibited in any Park.

SECTION 5. Fees and Permits. The Board of Directors may establish a schedule of fees for the use of Park facilities, and for the permits issued by the General Manager, as provided in this Ordinance. The General Manager may deny a permit on the basis that the applicant does not meet the requirements of the Rules and Regulations, or past performance indicated noncompliance with Park Rules and Regulations, or on the basis that the proposed use is injurious to the public safety, peace, and enjoyment of a Park. An applicant for a permit may appeal the denial thereof to the Board. The determination by the Board of Directors shall be final.

SECTION 6. Severability. If any provision of this Ordinance or application of it to any person or circumstance is held invalid or unconstitutional, no other provision shall be affected thereby.

SECTION 7. Effective Date. This Ordinance shall take effect 30 days after its final adoption by the District's Board of Directors.

SECTION 8. Posting. The District Secretary shall, within 15 days following final adoption of this Ordinance, publish a summary of the Ordinance, together with the names of the Directors voting for and against its adoption, in a newspaper published within San Joaquin County and of general circulation within the District.
